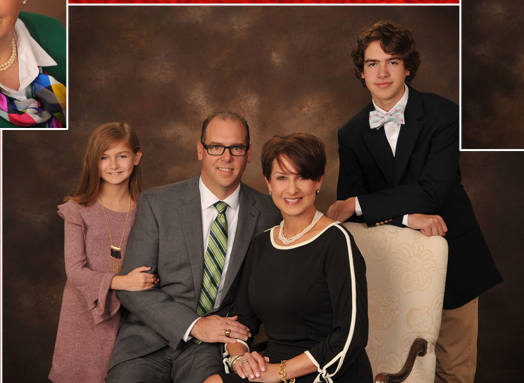
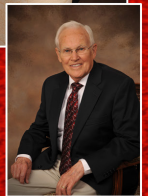
Tony Abbott Poetry Class
