This year's retreat, led by Jenny Beaumont, will be informed by a personality profiling tool based on the Enneagram. The Enneagram is about people -- how we are the same, how we are different, what makes us tick, how we get in our own way and how we develop our connection with The Divine. It describes nine fundamental personality styles, each of which has its own internal logic, strengths, talents and advantages, as well as limits, pitfalls and blind spots. As we begin to recognize our own patterns of behavior, it helps explain why we behave the way we do. Using the Enneagram as a tool, we will gain insights into our spirituality, our blind spots and how to nurture our relationships. Using the teaching and ministry of Jesus, we will explore how understanding each of the nine styles can lead us to a more authentic and full life.

Loaves & Fishes
